Administrators:

- 1. What changes in current programs are expected or desired over the next 5-10 years?
 - ELL growth need services growing into bilingual newcomer program dedicated language lab space
 - Birth-3 population unknown from year to year need more flexible space (CS) bring in more peer models
 - PreK daycare for employees early childhood at (HS)
 - Parent resource center
 - More in-district SPED programs (currently at capacity) enrich the model office space, etc. – shared services
 - World language lab HS MS ES (office spaces)
 - Maker spaces science labs MS ES STEM
 - Common spaces for classroom clusters
 - Professional Development space model classes
 - HS STEM & Career spaces mastery learning
- 2. What new programs or services do you envision over the next 5-10 years?
 - HS professional learning spaces needed (PLC)
 - Increasing clubs & activities (robotics, math team, etc.)
 - Computer labs infrastructure improvements testing as programs/services added overload is occurring
 - Lavatories (ES) hand washing (allergies) gender issues
 - HS life skills programs bring students back
 - NEASCC visitation coming soon need to review facility needs

 - Demographics are changing; more ELL students & more children living in poverty

- Enrollment does not seem to be declining at the rate of other school districts
- 5. To what extent or current space assets a help or hindrance in implementing instructional programs?
 - Modular classrooms; Poor functionality; Poor condition
 - MS entry needed to separate vehicular (parent) traffic from busses keep cars away from the buildings
 - Study how people enter & exit the premises
 - Safety glass
 - Parking need multiple evenings to accommodate participants
- 6. What are your preferences for school organization?
 - Grades 5-8 to 6-8; some grade 5/6 in modular classrooms
 - Parents prefer 6-8 vs. 5-8; prefer grade 5 in ES
 - K-1 isolates teachers; parents engage for two years, prefer longer term
 - Fewer transitions the better; transitions negatively impact students, faculty, parent/school relationships
 - There is some concern about the challenges of a larger school

 - Some community sentiment re: Center School historical sentiments/value not rationale for school needs
- 8. What are the best means of communicating with stakeholders and community?
 - Not addressed time constraints

Teachers:

- 1. What changes in current programs are expected or desired over the next 5-10 years?
 - ELL students increasing need for support space technology supports (some equipment issues, space for set up)
 - Improved space design to accommodate needs

- Increased special needs population; behavioral issues; need space modifications
 support staff & materials
- More adults in classrooms working with students (co-teaching)
- Additional preschool classes needed
- Multiple use SPED rooms room sharing presents scheduling and instructional issues
- Modular classrooms at Huckleberry closed this year; pushed classes into building
- Life skills classroom needed; more space needed; more equipment needed
- 2. What new programs or services do you envision over the next 5-10 years?
 - World language; ES needs office & room-scheduling
 - Enrichment programs dropped; should be restored; no services for G/T students; space needed at ES
 - STEM/STEAM
 - More PreK support
 - Daycare; used to do that at HS in child development classes; larger number of teachers going out on maternity leave
 - Applied courses in history & science
 - Vocabulary development programs; study skills and test prep
 - Literacy & math coaches (not pulled to cover classes); they need space to work
- 3. Do you expect any programs to be reduced in scope or eliminated?
 - Too many programs have been reduced in the past
 - Program at BHS has become too academic for a larger number of students; need more Voc-Tech experiences
- 4. What demographic changes are you experiencing?
 - More ELL students attending all schools
 - Enrollment declining somewhat some indications of more students than expected new apartments being built
 - Fewer students in class facilitates instruction (20 ideal)
- 5. To what extent or current space assets a help or hindrance in implementing instructional programs?
 - Lavatories needed
 - Play space & outdoor playgrounds; need stuff for kids to interact with and not just walk around; everyone should be playing
 - Storage shortage
 - Modular classrooms: most are in bad shape; smell moldy; they are outmoded get rid of them

- Cafeteria/gym at Huckleberry is a problem; team teaching with 50 students in main gym an issue; location of gym disrupts classrooms because of noise; space cannot accommodate the whole school; cafeteria scheduling impeded by gym
- Need space for indoor recess
- Science labs needed at ES
- 6. What are your preferences for school organization?
 - Consider two elementary schools; prefer two K-5 schools
 - Schools seem very large
 - Move grade 5 to elementary school; social & academic environment is an issue.
 - Transition from grade 1 to Huckleberry difficult; continuity lost
- 7. What are the community sentiments about possible school closings?
 - CS not viable as a K-5; Huckleberry also difficult
- 8. What are the best means of communicating with stakeholders and community?
 - Parents: dual language notices/messages
 - Teachers:
 - Residents: need viable tools for communicating with non-parents
 - Public Officials:
 - Other groups: need to better engage senior citizens0
- 9. What other planning issues should the task force be aware of?
 - HS water intrusion issues in auditorium
 - Check water intrusion at all schools
 - Meeting rooms professional development space needed at all schools
 - Teacher workroom separate from break rooms
 - PPT meeting rooms private spaces to meet with parents
 - Redesign office spaces
 - Safety & security seems well-managed; afterschool programs pose issues with possible exposure
 - Infrastructure design for flexibility & ease of use
 - Rolling closets taking away floor space in classrooms
 - Need bathrooms in lower grade classrooms

Custodial/Maintenance:

- 1. What changes are expected or desired over the next 5-10 years?
 - Replacing boilers
 - Underground fuel tanks

- Power supply needs to be upgraded
- CS has adequate panels -99% wood should be converted to other use
- Huckleberry ES needs significant electrical upgrades; safety issues wiring needs to be upgraded – the most in need of replacement of the whole system [energy efficient compound – geothermal] – an all electric heated school
- Redesign access points for outlets (3 phase panels)

 - HES: Limited storage space stuff stored in lunchrooms instruction in rooms not suited for classrooms
 - Outside storage for flammable materials
 - CES: old locker room used as office; 1938 built
 - CES: decide alternate use for the building
 - Not sure of property at HES; not sure if school can be added to
- 3. What are the community sentiments about possible school closings?
 - CES mixed opinion
- 4. What other planning issues should the task force be aware of?
 - Security & safety; cameras on outside of the building; all maintenance need communication tools (walkie-talkies); much already done; exterior lighting in parking areas
 - Energy efficiencies needed; need to invest in this area
 - Parking lots and sidewalks need to be addressed
 - Long-term capital projects plan needs to address many issues
 - Handicapped accessibility at all schools should be addressed; wheel chairs present
 - Clean air act; air exchange

Classified Employees:

- 1. What changes in current programs are expected or desired over the next 5-10 years?
 - HES: security & safety needs to be redesigned, set up better; an issue for all schools
 - Transitioning of students to office by disciplinary or other reasons space is inadequate needs redesign; no place for students who may be having an issue
 - CES: security issues, anyone can get in
 - Program changes have outpaced building modifications; schools were not built as inclusive schools

- Closing HES modular classrooms has impacted space use & flexibility; rooms now overcrowded
- SBAC will pose issues as diverse needs of students need to be accommodated need different rooms
- SPED population will increase; not sure enrollment will decline

 - ELL population increasing
 - Technology; more access, more integrated
 - World languages for all ES students
 - Designated world language rooms
 - Secure storage for confidential files
 - Protocols for school volunteers
 - Work space needs to be more secure; parents/volunteers workroom; PTO meeting areas
 - Need teacher workspace
 - Meeting spaces for staff & PD needed
 - Cafeteria/gym issues of scheduling
