Since there is no other space for comments, let me add that planning for school facilities is not just about buildings. It should be a holistic approach that considers curricula, models of teaching and learning, demographics of the current and projected student population, co-curricular spaces including the library, media rooms and teacher/administrator/aide areas for meetings and lesson preparation in the larger picture of the school buildings as environments for learning. Additionally, reassessment of facilities should not be delayed until there is a crisis. Every 2-3 years each building and instructional area must be evaluated for safety, cleanliness and ability to meet instructional needs. Let this be a time for learning from our past lapses and not a blame game again.

The report was actually not as awful as I would have expected, particularly at HHES. I had assumed a new building would be the only option. Now I would consider either option if the committee thought it best.
